**SIXTH MONTHLY APPLICATION OF SULLIVAN HAZELTINE ALLINSON LLC  
FOR COMPENSATION FOR SERVICES RENDERED AND REIMBURSEMENT  
OF EXPENSES AS COUNSEL TO THE DEBTORS FOR THE PERIOD  
FROM OCTOBER 1, 2010 THROUGH OCTOBER 31, 2010**

Sullivan Hazeltine Allinson LLC (“SHA-LLC” or “Applicant”), counsel to Moll Industries, Inc. and its affiliated debtors (the “Debtors”), hereby submits its application, pursuant to 11 U.S.C. §§ 330, 331 and 503(b)(4), Rule 2016 of the Federal Rules of Bankruptcy Procedure and Del. Bankr. L.R. 2016-2, for interim allowance of compensation for services rendered and for reimbursement of expenses incurred solely for the Debtors, and in further explanation respectfully represents:

**I. INTRODUCTION**

1. By this application, SHA-LLC seeks, with regard to the Debtors, (i) an interim allowance and award of compensation for professional services rendered by SHA-LLC, as counsel for the Debtors, for the period from October 1, 2010 through and including October 31, 2010 (the “Compensation Period”) in the amount of \$18,499.50 representing 80.90 hours in professional services; and (ii) reimbursement of actual and necessary expenses incurred by SHA-

LLC during the Compensation Period in connection with the rendition of such professional services in the amount of \$775.55 (the “Application”).

2. This Court has jurisdiction over this matter pursuant to 28 U.S.C. §§ 157 and 1334. This is a core proceeding pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 157(b)(2). Venue of this proceeding and this application is proper in this district pursuant to 28 U.S.C. §§1408 and 1409. The statutory predicates for the relief sought herein are 11 U.S.C. §§ 330, 331, 503(b)(4), Federal Rule of Bankruptcy Procedure 2016 and Del. Bankr. L.R. 2016-2.

## **II. BACKGROUND**

3. On April 27, 2010 (the “Petition Date”), the Debtors each filed with this Court a voluntary petition for relief under Chapter 11 of Title 11 of the United States Code (the “Bankruptcy Code”). Pursuant to sections 1107 and 1108 of the Bankruptcy Code, the Debtors are continuing to operate their businesses and manage their properties as debtors-in-possession. The Office of the United States Trustee appointed the Official Committee of Unsecured Creditors on May 10, 2010.

4. Prior to the Petition Date, the Debtors retained SHA-LLC as bankruptcy counsel to represent them in these proceedings. This Court approved the retention of SHA-LLC as counsel to the Debtors *nunc pro tunc* to April 27, 2010 (the “Retention Date”) by order dated May 20, 2010 (Docket No. 81).

5. Applicant has received no payments or promises of payment from any source other than the Debtors for services rendered or to be rendered in any capacity whatsoever in these cases. There is no agreement or understanding between SHA-LLC and any other person for the sharing of compensation in connection with this case other than in accordance with the provisions of the Bankruptcy Code.

6. The services for which compensation is being sought by SHA-LLC were rendered for and on behalf of the Debtors and not for or on the behalf of any other interested party in this bankruptcy proceeding.

### **III. TIME RECORDS AND HOURLY RATES**

5. William D. Sullivan, William A. Hazeltine and Heidi Coleman of SHA-LLC provided services for the Debtors during the Compensation Period. Mr. Sullivan was admitted to the Bar of the Supreme Court of Delaware in 1989. Mr. Sullivan became an associate with the Wilmington, Delaware law firm of Elzufon, Austin, Reardon, Tarlov & Mondell, P.C. in 1989 and established the firm's bankruptcy practice in 1995. He became a partner in 1998. In 2004, Mr. Sullivan joined Buchanan Ingersoll, P.C. as a partner in the bankruptcy practice group of its Wilmington, Delaware office. In July of 2006, Mr. Sullivan founded William D. Sullivan, LLC. On January 1, 2008, Mr. Sullivan became a member of SHA-LLC. Applicant charged \$360.00 per hour for services rendered by Mr. Sullivan during the period covered by this Application.

6. Mr. Hazeltine was admitted to the Bar of the Supreme Court of Delaware in 1994. Mr. Hazeltine became an associate with the Wilmington, Delaware law firm of Potter Anderson & Corroon LLP on August 15, 1994 and became a partner at Potter Anderson & Corroon LLP effective January 1, 2003. Mr. Hazeltine left Potter Anderson & Corroon LLP in 2004 and began his own practice in 2005. On January 1, 2008, Mr. Hazeltine became a member of SHA-LLC. Applicant charged \$340.00 per hour for services rendered by Mr. Hazeltine during the Compensation Period.

7. Ms. Coleman is a paralegal with SHA-LLC and has 12 years of experience as a paralegal. Applicant charged \$125.00 per hour for services rendered by Ms. Coleman during the period covered by this Application.

8. The total time spent by SHA-LLC representing the Debtors during the Compensation Period was 80.90 hours and the compensation sought for the Compensation Period is \$18,499.50. This equates to a blended rate of \$228.67 per hour.

9. Attached hereto as Exhibit A and incorporated herein by reference are SHA-LLC's time records showing a daily log of all time spent by SHA-LLC providing services for the Debtors during the Compensation Period by Project Category. The attached time records provide a detailed, day-by-day explanation of the services rendered by SHA-LLC in connection with this matter during that time. Applicant certifies that Applicant has reviewed Del. Bankr. L.R. 2016-2 and believes that the Application complies therewith.

10. Also included in Exhibit A, and incorporated herein by reference, is a summary of the expenses incurred by SHA-LLC during the Compensation Period on behalf of the Debtors. Expenses that SHA-LLC bills to its clients include charges for long distance telephone calls, photocopying, postage, courier services, Federal Express, court costs and transcript fees. The total expense for which reimbursement is sought in the Application is \$775.55. In a future fee application, SHA-LLC may seek reimbursement of additional expenses advanced or incurred on behalf of the Debtors during this Compensation Period that do not appear on Exhibit A.

#### **IV. GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF SERVICES RENDERED**

15. The services rendered by SHA-LLC that are the subject of this Application include the following:

(a) Asset Analysis and Recovery. During the compensation period, SHA-LLC professionals reviewed and revised the preference analysis.

(b) Asset Disposition. During the compensation period, SHA-LLC professionals (i) drafted a motion regarding the Debtors' Seagrove, NC facility and the sale of

raw materials; (ii) reviewed information regarding renewal, assignment of license agreement and possible sale of a patent related to the attachment of bristles to tooth brushes; (iii) discussed open issues and sale of remaining assets with parties in interest; (iv) reviewed real estate broker information; and (v) discussed sale of equipment and parts to Medrad.

(c) Business and Financial. During the compensation period, SHA-LLC professionals (i) attended board meetings, and (ii) discussed payment of commissions.

(d) Case Administration. During the Compensation period, SHA-LLC professionals (i) reviewed and revised motion to extend time to remove actions and motion to extend exclusivity period; (ii) responded to a cure inquiry of a creditor; discussed case status with parties in interest;(iii) drafted and filed report of ordinary course professionals; and (iv) discussed cash collateral and case status.

(e) Claim Administration. During the Compensation period, SHA-LLC professionals (i) discussed with parties in interest an estimate of the amount of priority and administrative claims and (ii) revised the administrative claim bar date motion.

(f) Lease/Contract Issues. During the Compensation Period, SHA-LLC professionals discussed payment of fees regarding Ernie Green Industries lease motion and operation of facility.

(g) Litigation. During the compensation period, SHA-LLC professionals (i) reviewed and discussed document requests from TMA; (ii) prepared responses to TMA's discovery requests; and (iii) reviewed the Committee's adversary complaint.

(h) Omnibus Hearings. During the Compensation period, SHA-LLC professionals (i) prepared agendas, hearing binders and certificates of no objection for applicable

documents for all hearings, (ii) communicated with the Court and parties in interest regarding omnibus hearings, and (iii) prepared for upcoming omnibus hearings in these cases.

(i) Pension and Retirement Plan Issues. During the Compensation period, SHA-LLC professionals (i) reviewed PBGC documents; (ii) reviewed Form 5500 for 401k plan; (iii) reviewed the Debtors' 401k plan; and (iv) drafted board resolutions regarding the Debtors' SERP and 401k plan.

(j) Professional Fees. During the Compensation period, SHA-LLC professionals prepared and filed fee applications for SHA-LLC, Merritt Sadler Group, LLP, and Shumaker, Loop & Kendrick and reviewed fee applications filed by other professionals.

## **V. CONCLUSION**

16. The compensation sought by Applicant is based on the normal hourly rates charged by Applicant for work of this character. The services rendered by Applicant to the Debtors were necessary and appropriate and to date have benefited the Debtors, their creditors, and estates. The amount of compensation sought by SHA-LLC is consistent with the factors enumerated in 11 U.S.C. §330, in that the amount sought is reasonable compensation for actual, necessary services rendered by the Applicant taking into account all relevant factors, including time spent on such services; the rates charged for such services; the complexity, importance, and nature of the problem, issue or task addressed; and the customary compensation charged by comparably skilled practitioners in cases other than cases under the Bankruptcy Code.

**WHEREFORE**, Applicant respectfully requests that this Court enter an order:

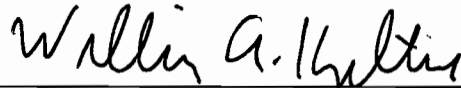
