**ORDER APPROVING THE EMPLOYMENT AND RETENTION OF

NUNC PRO TUNC TO MAY 11, 2010**

Upon the application (the "Application")² of the Creditors'

Committee for entry of an order authorizing the Committee to employ and retain Womble Carlyle as counsel in these cases nunc pro tunc, effective as of May 11, 2010; and upon the Declaration of Mark L. Desgrosseilliers, filed in support of the Application; and it appearing that proper notice of the Application has been given and that no further notice or hearing is required; and the Court being satisfied based on the representations made in the Application and the Declaration that (i) Womble Carlyle represents no interest adverse to the Debtors' estates or the Debtors' creditors and (ii) the employment of Womble Carlyle is necessary and in the best interests of the Committee and the Debtors' estates; and after due deliberation thereon, and sufficient cause appearing therefor, it is hereby:



ORDERED that the Application is granted; and it is further

ORDERED that, in accordance with Bankruptcy Code section 1103(a), the Committee is hereby authorized to employ and empowered to retain Womble Carlyle as its counsel, nunc pro tunc, effective as of May 11, 2010, to represent the Committee in the Debtors' Chapter 11 cases; and it is further

ORDERED that Womble Carlyle shall be compensated in accordance with the procedures set forth in Bankruptcy Code sections 330 and 331 and such Bankruptcy Rules as may then be applicable, from time to time, and such procedures as may be fixed by order of this Court.
